CVN Remains Committed to Providing High-Quality, Accessible Care to Military Families Across Hawai`i

Stamford, CT., March 18, 2025 – Cohen Veterans Network (CVN), a national not-for-profit network of mental health clinics for post-9/11 veterans, service members and their families, has named a new operating partner for its Steven A. Cohen Military Family Clinic in Mililani, Hawai`i. Beginning July 1, new clients in Hawai`i will be served by CVN's longtime partner Endeavors, which operates Cohen Clinics in San Antonio, Killeen, and El Paso, Texas. The transition in operating partners comes as CVN and Child & Family Service (CFS) mutually agreed not to renew the operating agreement for the Cohen Clinic in Mililani after four years.

"We thank Child & Family Service for their collaboration in supporting veteran and military families in Hawai`i," says Cohen Veterans Network president and CEO Dr. Anthony Hassan. "As we transition partners, CVN remains committed to serving the state's more than 220,000 post-9/11 veterans, active duty service members, and their families."

Child & Family Service will stop accepting new clients on April 1, 2025, and will complete operations on June 30, 2025. For clients currently engaged in care, services will continue to be provided by CFS through their current course of treatment. CVN and CFS are committed to ensuring that all clients receive the care they need during this transition.

"Child & Family Service extends warm aloha to the Cohen Veterans Network as we conclude our fouryear partnership," says Child & Family Service CEO Amanda Pump. "Together we helped over 3,000 Hawai`i-based veterans, service members and their families. We are grateful for the resources and collaboration we received from CVN and remain steadfast to strengthening families in Hawai`i, including our military, as we have for the past 125 years."

Beginning on July 1, new clients in Hawai`i will be served by Endeavors. The clinic will remain at its current location at 95-1091 'Āinamakua Dr, Mililani, HI 96789.

"Our top priority is to ensure that military families across Hawai`i have access to the military-culturally competent mental health care they need," says Endeavors CEO Chip Fulghum. "Through our expanded partnership with CVN, we are committed to filling the gaps in services and delivering our quality care across the region."

The Cohen Clinic in Mililani is one of 22 Steven A. Cohen Military Family Clinics, serving 20 states across the country. Since its inception in 2016, CVN has treated over 82,000 clients and provided nearly 715,000 clinical sessions. The network treats a wide variety of mental health concerns including depression, anxiety, PTSD, adjustment issues, anger, grief and loss, transition challenges, family issues, relationship problems, and children's behavioral problems. In addition to therapy, CVN provides comprehensive case



management services which can help clients with potential stressors such as unemployment, finances, housing, and more.

"Endeavors is a longtime operator of our Cohen Clinics," says Dr. Hassan. "Together, we can help ensure that military families across Hawai'i continue to receive the high-quality mental health care they deserve."
